Your adversary, the devil, prowls about like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour."

Gal 5:19-22 "Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I <u>forewarn</u> you just as I have <u>forewarned</u> you that those who practice such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God". There are many more to be found in the scriptures. Unfortunately, like me, many of us don't read all the warnings. Maybe if there were pictures of how destructive and painful ignoring those warnings could be, we would be more likely to pay attention to them.

Thank God we have Jesus. Luke 22:31-32 "Simon, Simon, behold, Satan has demanded permission to sift you like wheat; but I have prayed for you, that your faith may not fail". Like Peter, we too have failed in our devotion to Him, and like Peter, He has prayed for us too. When we have turned we too can again strengthen ourselves and our brothers and sisters.

So as we go about our daily lives don't ignore the WARNINGS.

Quilting Ministry


