Sips from the well (by Doug Clayton)

"A Change of Affection" (Book recommendation)

Becket Cook details his journey out of a homosexual lifestyle. Here's the description: "A gay man's incredible story of redemption. The powerful, dramatic story of how a successful Hollywood set designer whose identity was deeply rooted in his homosexuality came to be suddenly and utterly transformed by the power of the gospel."

The author addresses some misinformation about "gayness" and describes how God's Spirit changed his affection as Jesus Christ invited Becket into a relationship more meaningful and transcendent than any human relationship has to offer. He writes with empathy and grace towards the gay community while being clear that he had to choose obedience to Christ over continuing in a homosexual lifestyle. Becket, despite continuing to struggle with same sex attraction (which he describes as a result of a fallen and broken creation) daily chooses God's identity over sexual identity or sexual relationships with other men.

As with any book there may be details one doesn't completely agree with. Yet, if you read to learn you will be blessed. If you share this book with an LGBT friend or family member do so only after reading it yourself and praying over it. Then share it in a spirit of grace and humility remembering how Christ treated those who through ignorance, circumstance, weakness or choice were ensnared by sin. As the church of the Living and Loving God we must seek to rescue and reconcile realizing the Truth, easily mishandled, is delicate and precious just like each soul it seeks to liberate.

Grace is transforming. Becket's story reveals how God's redemptive power continues to change each of us and how none of us has a license to shun or dismiss anyone with the wave of a pious hand. To say "Love the sinner and hate the sin" sounds proper but often oozes disdain and makes loving people more complicated than Jesus made it. Becket helps us bridge this disconnect and invites us to understand people need more love than lecture.

As one might imagine Becket has come under persecution from many in the LGBT community for his "coming out" to Jesus Christ and the change in his life and lifestyle. Yet, he has also been able to use his redeeming story to help others to see the God of hope and compassion who desires each of us to change our affection, to look to God beyond all else for purpose, satisfaction and fulfillment in life.

The book is a fairly fast read. I found it enlightening while being challenged to more deeply value and consider those *not like me* and to treat all people with love, mercy, and patience rather than condemnation. "...Neither do I condemn you, go and sin no more." - Jesus
