The Grace of giving

Consider this article an attachment to this morning's sermon. Paul's theme is **generosity** as he wades into the awkward but necessary discussion of **giving**.

Paul describes giving as "a grace." It is not about the money but one's heart joyfully beating with the rhythm of God's grace that finds a way, even in poverty, to help others. Giving is a form of worship. Generosity brings a "harvest of righteousness" (not to be confused with that nefarious deception known as the prosperity gospel.) Some things war against a generous heart. I defer to that little known monk from the 17th century to explain:

"There are three things which produce love of material wealth: self-indulgence, self-esteem and lack of faith. Lack of faith is more dangerous than the other two. The self-indulgent person loves wealth because it enables him to live comfortably; the person full of self-esteem loves it because through it he can gain the esteem of others; the person who lacks faith loves it because, fearful of starvation, old age, disease, or exile, he can save it and hoard it. He puts his trust in wealth rather than in God, the Creator who provides for all creation, down to the least of living things." - Maximus the Confessor

I see no lack of faith in our church when it comes to the *grace of giving*. Over the years there has never been a financial need that we have not met together when asked by our shepherds. Despite this past year of financial uncertainty and inability to assemble at full capacity God has provided through your cheerful giving hearts. Your faithful generosity has encouraged others and your consistent financial gifts have never ceased funding our many good works as we support our missionaries and send Bibles, quilts, and gifts to the ends of the earth. Our local staff has not missed a single paycheck, you ensure the building expenses are covered while providing for the poor and homeless and so much more. Many of you give behind the scenes in wonderful ways as you volunteer your time. Your generosity is seen in your humble encouragement of others and in the gifts of your hands. You quietly minister by listening, encouraging, praying for the sick, checking on the homebound, and are personally invested in ways that go beyond what mere money can do. You are an ongoing glorious testimony that the "church has left the building!"

If you are feeling disconnected in this **grace of giving**, then you may be the one God is calling to act. Be sensitive to the Savior's prompt and the Spirit's nudge. The **grace of giving** is manifested in countless ways reflecting our trust in God to provide. The **grace of giving** brings a harvest of purpose, unity, and joy as we respond to the Father giving to us.

May God's love continue to move us in the grace of giving.
