As a child I loved the snow, as most kids do. I loved sledding down a big hill not far from our house, among other things. We loved playing "Fox and Goose" at school. Who hasn't caught the snowflakes on their tongue, made snowballs or snowmen, snow angels? After it had snowed long enough to clean the air and the last few inches that fell were clean, before anything or anyone had been out, while it was still snowing, we would gather enough snow for Grandma to make ice cream. Then after we had all been out and played in it, the white blanket that looked so white and clean was all trampled and dirty with sticks or tracks all over it. The once pristine landscape is now dirty and ruined. Then perhaps the next morning one looked out the window and it was pristine as it snowed again during the night. What was dirty and ugly is now once again white, clean and beautiful, glistening in the light.

It is so encouraging to think about how this applies to things in my life. Sometimes a day that begins beautifully takes a turn towards the ugly, and my efforts to clean it up seem not to be working. It still can be turned back to beautiful, but I need help to get it glistening. The God who turned the humiliation and shame of His son's death on the cross into the gift of salvation for all who believe in Him can take the tattered rags of my daily life and make them new every morning. Perhaps it is my life, not just a day, but life in general, that has taken on a dirty, ruined look and I can't seem to get it back to its pristine state.

There is one who can. My Lord did what it took a long time ago to keep my life glistening and white as snow and the blood price He paid continues to do that if I just recognize what I have done to get it dirty and go to Him to help me clean it up. On my own I am always going to be doing something that makes tracks and dirt in the white snow of my life but His blood covers me as the new snow storm covers the marks in the last one and it becomes white again.

I love that picture and assurance that His mercies are new every morning so I can see my life as I see the new snow when I look out the window in the morning: white and glistening in the light of the Lord.
