The secret of life

A father used to say to his children when they were young: —When you all reach the age of 12 I will tell you the secret of life.

One day when the oldest turned 12, he anxiously asked his father "what is the secret of life?"

The father replied that he was going to tell him, but that he should not reveal it to his brothers.

The secret of life is this: The cow does not give milk. "What are you saying?" Asked the boy incredulously. "As you hear it, son: The cow does not give milk, you have to milk it. You must get up at 4 in the morning, go to the field, walk through the corral full of manure, tie the tail, hobble the legs of the cow, sit on the stool, place the bucket and do the work yourself.

That is the secret of life, the cow does not give milk. You milk her or you don't get milk."

I read this story recently and it made me stop and think about my faith journey. I want to be clear that I do not believe that ANY amount of work will make us any bit more deserving or worthy of the salvation we have in Jesus. It is and will always be completely unmerited. That being said, I believe the truth of this little story has a significant impact on my path of following Jesus. I often find myself wondering why I haven't seen more spiritual growth in my life. Much of the time, I expect the "fruit of the Spirit" to come flowing from me in miraculous ways without any involvement on my part. I even feel frustrated at times that my faith feels less alive than it has in the past. Then I remember the words found in James 2, that faith, without works, is dead. If I'm honest with myself, the reasons I feel discouraged, dried up, worn out spiritually, and distant from God, are always the result of my lack of effort in my relationship with my maker. Do I spend time feeding on His word? Do I take every worry and anxious thought to Him in prayer? Do I serve others like He did? If we desire to "keep in step with the Spirit", allowing Him to bear fruit in our lives, we must put forth the effort to do so every day, not just an hour or two a week. The great news is that in spite of my shortness of work and effort, He never leaves me or forsakes me. This reminder doesn't come with a tone of disappointment from our God, but one of pure, unending love and desire for closeness from Him. Put in the work, the reword is too great not to!
