What would you do if you had been stripped of your clothes, beaten, and wrongly imprisoned?

A person would likely protest. They would cry out against the injustice that had just occurred. They might ask for a lawyer and demand a hearing in front of a higher authority. They would tell as many people as they could about this travesty.

Paul and Silas found themselves in such a situation. In Acts 16, they cast a demon out of a slave girl, and the slaveowners were not pleased. They had Paul and Silas stripped, beaten, and imprisoned. This was wrong! It was not right. What did Paul and Silas do?

"About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them." (Acts 16:25)

Because of their response, the entire prison heard about God. Because of their response, a jailor and his family were baptized. Paul and Silas did not respond as expected. They did not complain. They did not demand justice. They did not get angry. They trusted God, and they saw this as an opportunity to glorify God and share the good news with others.

We live in a fallen world, and because of this, we will be wronged, maligned, and cheated. How will we respond? Will we respond like Paul and Silas? Will we follow in the footsteps of Jesus? Will we glorify God, or will we act like everyone else? We can expect to be mistreated. It happens to everyone. We get to choose how we will respond.
