The Kingdom of Righteousness.

Christians belong to God's kingdom, the kingdom of righteousness. In what we know as Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount," in describing the character of his followers, He said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness for they shall be satisfied." (Matt. 5:6). And in the same context Jesus said "...(continually) seek first His kingdom and His righteousness..." (6:33). In still another discourse Jesus states, I am the Bread of Life; the one who comes to Me will not hunger, and the one who believes in Me will never thirst. (John 6:35) Precious promises!

Paul reminds Christians in 2 Cor. 5:21 that He (God) made Him (Jesus) who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." Only in Jesus can one become the righteousness of God. And we recognize that faith in the Son of God and baptism into Him puts one into Christ (Gal. 3:26-27). In our becoming the righteousness of God, for what do we seek, hunger and thirst? Righteousness!

A definition of righteousness is described by Thayer as "...the state of (one) who is such as (one) ought to be. Broadly that which is upright or virtuous, displaying integrity, purity of life, and correctness in feeling and action." (Zondervan's Bible Encyclopedia, Vol 5, p. 104). We recognize such qualities in Jesus who Himself was "the exact representative of God's nature" (Heb. 1:3). Notice that "perfection" is not our issue.

W.E. Vine declares that righteousness "is that gracious gift of God...to all who believe" in Christ and are then "brought into right relationship with God. This righteousness is unattainable by obedience to any law or by one's own merit or any other condition than that of faith in Christ." In Christ we become all that God requires us to be, all that we could never be in ourselves.

Zondervan's treatise on righteousness reads: It is "...a power more than a standard, a life more than a code, a loyalty, and a saving relationship for everyday living." Paul reminds Roman Christians (14:17), "...the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit." Isaiah, some 750 years before Paul, wrote: "And the works (fruit) of righteousness will be peace, and the service (effect) of righteousness, quietness (calmness) and confidence (security) forever." (32:17)

The question then becomes, am I as a citizen of God's kingdom living that precious gift given through faith in Jesus Christ despite my circumstances or trials or imperfections or the world's chaos? Is righteousness evident in my life.
