# From the Shepherd' Pen

I don't normally recommend movies, but here are two that are based on true stories of hope, inspiration, determination, and overcoming that will leave you feeling good when we need it.

<u>"The Rookie"</u>: A small town Texas high school baseball coach..(I'll not spoil it for you) promises something to his team if they made the playoffs. This commitment leads to an unusual life experience that..(I'll not spoil it for you). <u>"Rudy"</u>: Rudy harbored a dream to play on the University of Notre Dame College football team, despite being extremely undersized and lacking in talent. In the last game of his senior year the coach..(I'll not spoil it for you).

Here are 3 familiar bible stories of hope, sacrifice, determination, faith and overcoming the odds.

#### David verses Goliath - 1 Samuel

Everyone must have thought David was crazy. It must have seemed incredible to those who were watching David take on a giant; a seasoned warrior who was as fully equipped as they come that day because only the Philistines had the ability to make iron shields, armor, and spears and Goliath the Giant had them all. The Philistine forces that watched David taking on Goliath must have thought, "It's over...Goliath can't lose." Perhaps even King Saul thought that too, as well as most of the Israelite forces. However, David seemed to know something the others didn't and that was he knew God was with him and would fight "for him" and not "with him."

#### Gideon verse the Midianites - Judges 6

God loves an underdog. Sporting events are a great venue for making the point. Gideon is a perfect example of the underdog. God often chooses those who the world has little expectations of so that God can receive the glory that He rightfully deserves anyway. God knew that Gideon's tiny little force of 300 farmers and shepherds could never destroy a camp of 135,000 seasoned, experienced, and well-trained Midianites soldiers but with God, all things are possible. So never lose hope, even if the odds look exceedingly hopeless.

#### Moses verses Pharaoh - Exodus

Moses almost didn't live to see the day of his birth as Pharaoh had commanded that all the Israelite baby boys be killed because he was concerned about the growing size of the nation of Israel. Pharaoh was worried that if Egypt went to war, the millions of Israelite slaves would join sides with the enemy and Egypt would be defeated. Moses was a shepherd for forty years and the similarities of Jesus bringing us out of the slavery of sin and Moses leading Israel out of Egyptian slavery is remarkable. God manifested Himself to Moses for the purpose of being His human agent to go back to Egypt and free God's chosen people even though Moses originally told God "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the children of Israel out of Egypt" but as you know, it's not "who" you are but "Whose you are."

The Christian faith is not an "I hope I'm right" strategy but an "I know I'm right" confidence. Not because of arrogance, but rather a determined belief. God takes the least in the world and does the most through them so that He is glorified.

May God bless us all with faith and confidence that only He can provide.
