A Brief History Of Thanksgiving

In September 1620, a small ship called the <u>Mayflower</u> left Plymouth, England, carrying 102 passengers—an assortment of religious separatists seeking a new home where they could freely practice their faith and other individuals lured by the promise of prosperity and land ownership in the New World. After a <u>treacherous and uncomfortable crossing</u> that lasted 66 days, they dropped anchor near the tip of Cape Cod. One month later, the Mayflower crossed <u>Massachusetts</u> Bay, where the <u>Pilgrims</u>, as they are now commonly known, began the work of establishing a village at Plymouth.

In November 1621, after the Pilgrims' first corn harvest proved successful, Governor William Bradford organized a celebratory feast and invited a group of the fledgling colony's Native American allies, including the Wampanoag chief Massasoit. Now remembered as American's "first Thanksgiving" the festival lasted for three days.

The preceding winter had been a harsh one for the colonists. Seventy-eight percent of the women who had traveled on the Mayflower had perished that winter, leaving only around 50 colonists to <u>attend the first Thanksgiving</u>. According to eyewitness accounts, among the pilgrims, there were 22 men, just four women and over 25 children and teenagers. (History.com)

At that first Thanksgiving they had much to feel sorrow for. The loss of so many by disease and starvation. But they also had much to be thankful for. A bountiful harvest and a new beginning. The same holds true today. Some have lost loved ones, others have suffered thru illness. But we too have much to be thankful for. have an amazing church family who support each other. We have a God that will never abandon us. He will watch over us, give us grace, and love us unconditionally. Though this year may be different from other Thanksgivings, fewer gathering, more staying at home. We still have much to thank God for. May God bless you and keep you.
