Devious

Sips from the well (by Doug Clayton)

C.S. Lewis' "The Screwtape Letters" is a must read classic. Written from Satan's viewpoint, Screwtape is the chief demon who mentors his imp nephew Wormwood in the art of tempting his human "patient."

God is faithful and uses these current challenges to strengthen us as well as remind us how Satan is subtly and deviously at work. My words below are an attempt at Lewis' "Screwtape-like" dialogue: If I were Screwtape what would I advise to distract and disrupt American Christians in 2020:

Loyalties: Convince Christians to become consumed in politics, subtly help them think the kingdoms of men more important, or at least equal to, the Kingdom of God. If we can nudge them to believe they are electing a savior that works into our master plan even better; then watch the fireworks as the masses use the glorious mess to rationalize seeking **us** instead of **Him.**

Unrest: Inflict ministers and other church shepherds with worry and exhaustion. Add to their misery by goading their flocks into impatience and unjust criticism over their pandemic decisions. While we're at it, consider how you might use their tiresome "**Love your neighbor**" mantra against them. And, don't underestimate the value of accusation to discourage and sap their strength and resolve.

Masks: Ah yes, such an ingenious little tool of dissension. Make mask wearers think they don't trust God enough to keep them safe while getting them to look suspiciously and with disdain upon those who don't wear masks. Induce non-mask wearers to judge mask wearers as gullible sheep selling out to a grand conspiracy. The more they judge each other the better for us!

Church: Implant in their minds the comfortable notion that online church is not a short term inconvenience but a long term solution. Church attendance worked in our favor for centuries as we anesthetized their faith with religious routine and subverted their influence with divisive dogmas. But, be careful, for if they go back to church now they might actually *become* the church, a more unified force with a renewed zeal would be very detrimental to our cause. Comfort and Complacency, those ever reliable ruts, may be just the ticket for this problem. Continue to implant the lie that the Nazarene Carpenter is content with them as occasional religious consumers instead of daily practitioners of their calling.

Fear: Above all instill fear! Stampede the whole herd! I've got it! For starters create a toilet paper shortage. Then mess with Wall St., topple statues, start some fires in the forests and streets, fan the flames of racial division, and just for fun plant one of our pesky flies on the VP's head during a public broadcast. Then sit back and cackle! Make them fearful for the future and continue to stir their little hearts with terror. FEAR is our friend! It shrouds love, undermines truth and trust in their Father. Scare 'em, they'll lose hope, break ranks with the Enemy and come running into our snare!

You be the judge. Would these devious tactics work? Are they working on you? Satan fears an uprising of spiritual growth, a revolution of unity in the church and renewed trust in the Lord Almighty! Don't fall for Satan's schemes. Rather, Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Do not lean on your own understanding but in all your ways acknowledge Him and he will direct your paths!
