Abide with Me: Abide in Me

"Abide with Me" is a Christian hymn by Scottish Anglican Henry Francis Lyte. Lyte composed the hymn in 1820 while visiting a dying friend. As Lyte sat with the dying man, the man kept repeating the phase "abide with me....". After leaving the man's bedside, Lyte wrote the hymn.

The hymn is a prayer asking God to remain with each of us throughout our life, through our trials, and even through death. The first verse of the hymn reads:

Abide with me; fast falls the eventide; The darkness deepens; Lord with me abide. When other helpers and comfort flee, Help of the helpless, O abide with me.

The first line in this verse is taken from Luke 24:29, "Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent".

The last verse of the hymn reads:

Hold Thou Thy cross before my closing eyes; Shine through the gloom and point me to the skies. Heaven's morning breaks, and earth's vain shadows flee; In life, in death, O Lord, abide with me.

This verse was inspired by 1 Corinthians 15:55, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave where is thy victory?

When we are at our lowest point emotionally, spiritually or even physically, we will ask Jesus to "Abide with Me". Jesus will come when He seems at a distance. Jesus will come when we seek Him.

But Jesus wants a relationship with us all the time! Jesus tells us in John 15:7, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you". What a promise! This verse says if we will abide in Jesus and if His teachings abide in us, we can do anything. Our prayers will be answered because we know Jesus. Jesus wants to know us, to have a connection with us.

Let us today prayerfully cultivate that relationship, so that when we ask Jesus to "Abide with Me", He will say because you "Abide in Me", it will be done.
