Discernment

We live in a complicated world in which we are currently facing a pandemic with all kinds of health care concerns, a highly charged election season, wildfires causing huge disruptions to life, weather disasters, high unemployment with many threatened with eviction and facing financial disaster, international disputes, and on and on and on. Somehow, as Christians, we need to try to make sense of what's occurring and then intentionally act in a Christlike way. Here is a quick study that I hope will help you better evaluate matters and make better decisions.

To discern means:

To distinguish and to separate out so as to investigate by looking throughout

To apprehend clearly

To seek/acquire insight

To examine, scrutinize, question, test, prove

To discriminate between various options

Discernment involves awareness, understanding, analysis, evaluation, and the exercise of wisdom

As Christians we are meant to discern:

good from evil (Heb. 5: 14)

the will of God (Rom. 12: 1-2)

that which is pleasing to God (Eph. 5: 9-10)

that which is excellent (Phil. 1: 9-10; Phil. 4: 8)

What is God's will?
