Maps

I have always enjoyed looking at maps. My dad always kept a road atlas in our cars when I was young, and we would put it to good use on our frequent weekend trips. He'd stop at some dirt road intersection somewhere between Texas and Kansas and say "ok, which way do I need to turn?". It was one of my favorite games. It didn't take me long to figure out that we couldn't travel on the blue lines, and that tracking what towns and cities we passed through helped me to be able to quickly find our location.

When I was 17, my dad and I took part in a weeklong back country canoeing trip through southern Ontario. While we had a map with us to navigate our way home, it was nothing like the road atlas I grew up with. It simply showed lake after lake with the occasional connecting stream. There was this big lake, and then 3 little lakes followed by a stretch of river and then a few medium lakes. We got to decide how and where to proceed, and often there was not even much of a trail. It was an exhilarating experience that hooked me on the feeling of freedom that only untouched nature can provide.

Nowadays, we've all but forgotten how to use a map. We just type in an address, or more frequently just follow a link and Google does the work for us. Push button navigation. We can even choose the tone of voice and even the accent we want giving us directions (you're less likely to miss an exit when Darth Vader is giving the commands!) Like many things in life, our culture has quickly become quite dependent on this luxury.

I think the Bible is a bit like a map. It provides us the direction we need to navigate through life. Without it, we'd be lost with no bearing or sense of direction. I often find myself using the word of God like the navigation system on my phone instead of the maps I used on that canoeing trip. Sometimes I just want to be told where to turn, when to expect delays, even given an alternate route if need be, but God's map doesn't work that way. His divine power gives us everything we need in this life, and His word teaches, trains, and equips us for every good work, every turn along the way. Yet, God gives us the freedom to choose when, where, and how we navigate. Certainly, there's always a best choice when we come to life's intersections, and often there are choices that take us in the absolute wrong direction, but it is important that we always remember that this life is a journey. We must never forget our destination (the Father) and always let His word guide us closer and closer as we live through this adventure called life.
